Description

The Sign Language Communication Certificate program is designed to equip students with proficiency in American Sign Language (ASL) communication and understanding of Deaf culture, preparing them for career enhancement or further study in ASL interpretation or Deaf studies. Students engage in coursework that covers ASL grammar, vocabulary, syntax, and conversational skills.

Admissions Requirements

- Qualified high school juniors and seniors with a minimum in-progress high school GPA of 2.5
- A high school diploma or GED
- Credentials earned outside of the US must be evaluated by an approved agency
- GPA of 2.0 or higher
- Official transcripts from all previously attended institutions
- Completed application with Carolina University

Graduation Requirements

- Shall complete all credit hours at CU;
- Shall have maintained a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0;
- Shall have earned a C or better in all courses in the curriculum.
